- Price for hay hardly changed and cattle prices ticked up only slightly.

• Result – hold on a wait for better times.

2010


- Fuel and fertilizer prices are way down.
- Cattle prices down, but not greatly.
- Herbicide prices have been stable.

 Result – many of our pastures are in need of some attention



metsulfuron	0.5 oz	\$6	Many broadleaf – bermuda only
Weedmaster	1 qt	\$8	Annual broadleaf
GrazonNext	1 qt	\$9	Thistle, pigweed, dogfennel, etc
Cleanwave + 2,4-D	1 pt + 1qt	\$11	dogfennel
Remedy	1 qt	\$20	blackberry


- So, weed control and fertilize will give similar yields, but weed control is cheaper.

Mowing

- CONS
- Too late to prevent competition.
- Perennials will regrow.
- PRO
- May prevent weed seed production.
- May satisfactorily control of dogfennel.

Mowing

Take home point

Do you really want to spend \$8 - \$15/A for inconsistent weed control?

Do I spray or fertilize first?

- Spray first.
- Control existing weeds.
- Begin soil-test based lime and fertilizer program.



Spray or Mow?

 I would only mow if it is for small areas.

 Large-scale mowing will cost more than it gives.
