### Course Description

Advanced training in animal and/or animal products evaluation.

### Course Learning Objectives

- To instill critical thinking and decision-making skills in students via training in animal and products evaluation and participation in intercollegiate competition.
- To improve communication skills and build leadership in students via training in animal and products evaluation and participation in intercollegiate competition.
- To expose students to animal agriculture outside of Florida through travel involved with animal and products evaluation training

### Course Overview and Purpose

ANS 4605- Animal and Products Evaluation is the course title students are enrolled in while receiving advanced training in animal and/or products evaluation as a participant of a competitive education team in the Department of Animal Sciences. To gauge mastery of the skills acquired through this course, students are required to represent the University of Florida in intercollegiate contests.

We will attempt to schedule some weekend workouts as opportunities arise. The instructor and/or the teaching assistants are available to facilitate watching extra videos and/or giving extra sets of reasons. Team trips to local shows and events should be expected.

## Travel

Each student’s opportunity to compete on a traveling team will be based on the following criteria, all to be weighed evenly and the instructor will make the final decision:

- Effort
- Attendance
- Timeliness
- Attitude
- Placing scores
- Reasons scores
- Teamwork

Entry fees and travel expenses (minus meals) are paid for by the University, as budget permits. Team members are expected to assist with fundraising and outside judging events throughout the year to maintain necessary budget for travel.

## Grading Policy

The primary parameter utilized to assess grades is attendance. All placing and reasons scores will be recorded throughout the semester, but we mainly grade on completion and overall improvement throughout the course. During the semester, students will meet approximately 27 times. Students will lose 8 percentage points from their final grade for each unexcused absence. Therefore, students with one unexcused absence may still earn an A, whereas students with five unexcused absences will likely receive an E.
